## **Local news**

## Crawfordjohn

GW reported that the re-surfacing work on the road into Crawfordjohn had been completed. South Lanarkshire Council have offered to fund the cost of a wicker coffin for the burial of the bones which were discovered during the demolition of the school.

#### Wiston

CS advised that Ed Archer will present a talk on the history of the local area in Wiston Hall on the 24<sup>th</sup> of April at 7.00pm. The hall committee would like to plant bulbs and flowers around the hall as CS asked if a micro grant application would be appropriate for this.

### Lamington

IR has sent a second reminder to Amey Highways regarding the street lighting in Lamington but has not received a response. IR also reported that her car had recently been badly damaged after hitting stones/boulders on the A702. She had reported the incident to Police who informed her that Amey Highways were responsible for keeping the road surface clear.

JMcL reported that the roads assessor had inspected the road from Lamington to Langholm Farm but he believed he had only inspected the road as far as Lamington Mains Farm. As yet, no remedial work on the road surface has been carried out, despite it being a school bus route. Three new grit bins have been installed but JMcL asked for one to be moved from Lamington Mains to the top of the Dean Wood. EH to ask SLC for this.

#### Coulter

MM reported that work on Craigend Bridge has been completed.

#### **AOCB**

Cllr EH informed that SLC have a new manager, Grant Newbiggin, for the Roads Department. EH has also had a meeting with PC Wessencraft regarding road safety, particularly in the Thankerton area. The police speed detection van is to be in this area more often and solid white line road markings are to be installed on the A73 in the Thankerton area.
